Dear Governor Nixon, President Pro Tem Dempsey and Speaker Jones:

The Fiscal Year 2014 approved state budget allocated \$100,000 for the Missouri Film Office under the Missouri Division of Tourism. With the recommendation of the Film Commission Chair, Andrea Sporcic was hired full time with benefits as the Film Office Specialist and reports directly to Katie Steele Danner, director of the Missouri Division of Tourism. Andrea's contacts and knowledge of the film industry have been invaluable in both attracting productions from outside our state and helping to grow our own in-state industry.

In 2013, assistance was provided to 123 television series and segments, commercials, films and web production projects throughout the state. We added more than 200 locations to the state-wide location database. Twentieth Century Fox filmed *Gone Girl* over six weeks in Cape Girardeau. The film is directed by Oscar-nominated filmmaker David Fincher and stars Oscarwinner Ben Affleck.

We partnered with the successful True/False Film Festival in Columbia, Kansas City Film Fest, St. Louis Filmmaker's Showcase, Citizen Jane Film Festival in Columbia and the St. Louis International Film Festival. Additionally, the Film Office continued to support the growth of the up-and-coming National 4-H Film Festival in Branson, bringing families in from throughout the country.

Film festivals not only stimulate tourism, they often provide a platform to celebrate our own Missouri film talent. Two documentaries shot by MU graduates have been very well received this year; *Caucus* and *We Always Lie to Strangers* have been shown throughout the country to much critical acclaim.

The Film Office also presented workshops on working with the film and digital media industry at the Missouri Economic Development Council Conference and The Governor's Conference on Tourism.

The members of the Missouri Film Commission strongly support the work of the Film Office under the Division of Tourism. We would still advocate an incentive program to help the office in attracting additional business, but with the support of our Legislature and our leaders, the Missouri Film Office will continue to promote our film industry as it becomes an integral part of a diverse and healthy Missouri economy.

Film Commission Activity

History

The Missouri Film Commission was established in 1983 as a working office within the Division of Tourism, Department of Economic Development. The Commission was created to attract film, television, video and cable productions to Missouri and to promote the growth of the film and video production industry within Missouri. In 1998, an appointed state-wide Film Commission Board was established by statute 620.1200, to advise the Director of the Department of Economic Development on the promotion and development of film production and facilities. According to the statute: "The commission shall provide oversight and guidance to the Director of Economic Development in administering the Office of the Missouri Film Commission."

Missouri Film Office

The FY2014 General Assembly re-allocated \$100,000 from the Missouri Division of Tourism (MDT) general revenue transfer earmarked for film office activity. This allocation now includes an FTE. MDT hired Andrea Sporcic as film office specialist.

The Missouri Film Office works to develop, coordinate and market the film industry and film-related activities in Missouri. The Missouri Film Office serves as the official central point of contact for all state-wide inquiries: film, TV shows/segments, commercials, web content, and digital media.

The Missouri Film Office maintains and markets a large photo database of diverse locations across the state and keeps current a state-wide database of skilled workers, special equipment operators and support service companies.

The Film Production Tax Credit program has sunset as of November 28, 2013, according to Missouri Statute 135.750.


Film Office Activity 2013
